Applicant Communications

Pre-Interview Communication Guidance: This is what signaling is for. Not recommended.

Post-Interview Communication Guidance: Applicants should ask programs when they interview what they expect. Programs should be transparent about their wishes.

Open Houses / Second Looks

Open Houses: None noted.

Second Looks: They should be optional if offered at all and not used to determine ranking. Programs should consider submitting their rank order list in advance to mitigate the risk of bias.
