Program Directors Association Guide for Residency Applicants

Pediatrics

The *Program Directors Association Guide for Residency Applicants* is a collaborative effort between the Organization of Program Directors Association (OPDA), Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC), and American Medical Association (AMA). Its purpose is to provide specialty-specific guidance, application information, and resources. This guide outlines specialty-level guidance and policies for applicants to Pediatrics programs.

Specialty responses in this guide were provided through a standardized web form. The corresponding questions from that form are referenced in the footnotes. If a specialty indicated "No specialty recommendation to programs," it means the specialty does not provide guidance on how programs should approach that aspect of the selection process.

Please note that not all aspects of the residency application process are standardized at the specialty level. Applicants should review individual program requirements in Residency Explorer^{TM} tool, FREIDA TM , or on program websites.

Applicant Communications

Pre-Interview Communication Guidance: Applicants should indicate interest in a program using ERAS preference signals.

Post-Interview Communication Guidance: We discourage post-interview communication unless it is:

- 1. A thank you note (and this is considered optional).
- 2. Specific follow-up questions from the interview day.
- 3. Updates to provide to an application (e.g., new publication, award).

Letters of intent are not expected and if sent, should only be sent to one program. Programs are not expected to reply to such communications.

Open Houses / Second Looks

Open Houses: Program-sponsored virtual information sessions and social "Meet and Greets": in addition to the webinars mentioned above some programs may offer virtual information sessions. Programs should limit any individual program virtual open houses to one which is recorded and available for applicants.

Attendance at open houses should be optional and not used as an indication of an applicant's interest.

Second Looks: Programs hosting in-person visits/second looks after interviews have concluded should participate in the NRMP Voluntary ROL Lock Pilot to ensure visits do not impact an applicant's position on the rank list.

Open houses, in-person visits, second looks, and other program-sponsored events are optional and intended to help applicants learn more about programs. Attending these events is not necessary to "express interest." Applicants should consider in-person visits or second looks only for a few programs (at most) that may help them make final decisions for their rank list.
