# **Program Directors Association Guide for Residency Applicants**

# Public Health and General Preventive Medicine

The *Program Directors Association Guide for Residency Applicants* is a collaborative effort between the Organization of Program Directors Association (OPDA), Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC), and American Medical Association (AMA). Its purpose is to provide specialty-specific guidance, application information, and resources. This guide outlines specialty-level guidance and policies for applicants to Public Health and General Preventive Medicine programs.

Specialty responses in this guide were provided through a standardized web form. The corresponding questions from that form are referenced in the footnotes. If a specialty indicated "No specialty recommendation to programs," it means the specialty does not provide guidance on how programs should approach that aspect of the selection process.

Please note that not all aspects of the residency application process are standardized at the specialty level. Applicants should review individual program requirements in Residency Explorer™ tool, FREIDA™, or on program websites.

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# Specialty Guidance for the 2025–2026 Cycle

Public Health and General Preventive Medicine has published a statement: All PH/GPM Programs require successful completion of at least PGY-1 including 10 months of direct patient care. Activities in Pathology will not count towards direct patient care. Rarely, one or two programs may have one or two slots for a three-year residency training program that includes preliminary/PGY-1.

Application deadline to be considered for interview <sup>1</sup>	When programs start receiving applications from ERAS (Beginning September 24; The typical interview offer window is between October 2025 and January 2026.) While applications can be submitted after September 24 through the interview period, later submissions may or may not receive interview dates as offers to interview will occur in accordance with interview availability within the desired program.
Application materials accepted after the deadline <sup>2</sup>	Letters of recommendation, MSPE, Step 1 or Level 1 transcripts, Step 2 or Level 2 transcripts

**Additional Deadline Guidance:** Applicants are recommended to submit additional materials as soon as possible after the initial application is submitted. Delayed submission of materials may result in delays in interview offers.

#### **Match Platform**

Public Health and General Preventive Medicine participates in the National Resident Matching Program (NRMP) and Military Match.

**Additional Guidance:** Military programs participate in the military match. The list of programs participating in the match is available in the NRMP Directory.

#### **Use of USMLE and/or COMLEX-USA Scores**

Deadline to submit license exam transcripts to be considered for interview <sup>3</sup>	Applicants should ideally have their Step 1, Step 2CK transcripts, or COMLEX Level 1 or Level 2-CE available for program's review by the application opening date. Most programs require successful completion of Step 3 by the program start date.
Deadline to submit license exam transcripts to be ranked <sup>4</sup>	Prior to rank order list opening
USMLE transcripts required for DO applicants? <sup>5</sup>	No specialty recommendation to programs

Required number of LORs	Three (including one from current residency director)
Required specialty-specific letters <sup>6</sup>	One of three recommendation letters must be from a current or previous residency program director

**Additional Guidance for Specialty-Specific Letters:** It is recommended that the letters provided are recent (within the last year) specific to the specialty to which you are applying (except for letter from your residency program director).

**Guidance for Transitional Year/Prelim Programs:** One of three recommendation letters must be from a current or previous residency program director. It is recommended that the letters provided are recent (within the last year) specific to the specialty to which you are applying (except for letter from your residency program director).

**Guidance for IMG Applicants:** One of three recommendation letters must be from a current or previous residency program director. It is recommended that the letters provided are recent (within the last year) specific to the specialty to which you are applying (except for letter from your residency program director).
