# Surgical Critical Care

#### **Additional Guidance for Specialty-Specific Letters:**

- Recommended date by which all LORs should be submitted: As Soon As Possible (ASAP).
- Give your Recommenders advance notice.
- SAFAS application requires entering names and E-mail addresses for 3 Recommenders.
- Submit your Application Do NOT wait for Recommenders to complete letters.
- Each Recommender will be asked to complete 2 tasks: Separate and Standardized LORs.
